Inferencing

* Good Readers ask questions that cause them to infer while they read. (This means you need to use your background knowledge to help you figure out what is implied in the story but not specifically stated.)

HFW: also, blue, every, fall, family, first, many, most, mountain, only

FYI: The current week's ELA test will use the previous week's HFW in the sentence.

*This semester I will be averaging your child's weekly sentence homework into a grade for their report card. Math: Telling Time
